Medical Education Grants Eligibility and Exclusionary Criteria

All Grant Requests are reviewed in accordance with the <u>Innovative Medicines Canada Code of</u> <u>Ethical Practices (IMC)</u>.

Eligibility Criteria

Support may be considered for requests in the following therapeutic area:

- Immunology (Inflammatory Bowel Disease, Rheumatology, Dermatology)
- Neuroscience (Schizophrenia, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder)
- Cardiovascular & Metabolism
- Pulmonary Arterial Hypertension
- Retina Disease
- Oncology (Hematology: Multiple Myeloma, Chronic Lymphocytic Leukemia, Mantle Cell lymphoma; Genitourinary Oncology Lung; Prostate and Bladder Cancer)

Requests can be accepted from:

- Academic Institutions
- Hospitals
- Medical Societies
- Healthcare Professional Associations
- Registered Not for Profit Organizations
- Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Providers

Exclusionary Criteria

Requests will not be accepted from:

- Individuals
- Private Clinics
- For Profit Organizations
- Medical Education Agencies/Vendors

Examples of ineligible Grant Requests may include but are not limited to:

- Activities lacking a focus on learning and development.
- Activities targeting inappropriate audiences. Medical Education Grants are intended to support the learning and development of Health Care Professionals, as defined by the IMC's Code of Ethical Practices.
- Grant Requests for funding activities outside of Canada
- Invitation to Janssen Inc., to control, influence or participate in the design or conduct of the activity or to acquire a tangible benefit.

- Research/Clinical activities (including patient involvement and Investigator Initiated Studies)
- Grant Requests with the intent that Janssen Inc.'s funding would cover the entire costs involved to run the program/project.
- Grant Requests received outside Janssen Inc.'s therapeutic areas.
- Grants to individuals
- Fellowships that support students pursuing Masters, PhD or MD designations. (Fellowship grants support individuals who have completed their PhD and/or MD.)
- Personal travel
- Entertainment
- Operating expenses to support existing costs associated with equipment, textbooks or subscriptions to publications, online meeting platforms, website development and maintenance or phone lines, etc.
- Overhead costs (i.e., salaries excluding fellows, rent, insurance, utilities, etc.)
- Professional career development
- Requests for programs that have already started or are in progress.
- Recognition awards
- Prizes
- Charitable Contributions
- Grant Requests to support only food and beverage.
- Activities held in lavish venues/resort/restaurant locations that do not meet the criteria as stated in <u>IMC</u>'s Code of Ethical Practices
- Journal Clubs and/or Rounds meetings held outside a hospital, a clinic or an academic institution.
- Travel costs for any non-faculty participants
