


HIV in the UK


40 years after the first diagnosis, **science has transformed human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) from an acute fatal illness to a manageable, chronic condition.**

In 2019 the UK continued to achieve the UNAIDS **90-90-90 target:**¹



For the first time since 2010 the number of people living with HIV aged 50+ years matches that of those aged 35-49 years, **showing that people with HIV are living longer.**^{2,3}

Despite the significant progress made, **HIV remains one of the greatest global health threats of our time.**



Of the estimated 105,200 people living with HIV in the UK in 2019, **~6,600 did not know they are HIV positive.**¹

HIV stigma still affects diagnosis, care and the emotional well-being of those living with HIV.

The COVID-19 pandemic has impacted health systems: HIV testing was reduced and health services relating to prevention and treatment have been disrupted.
