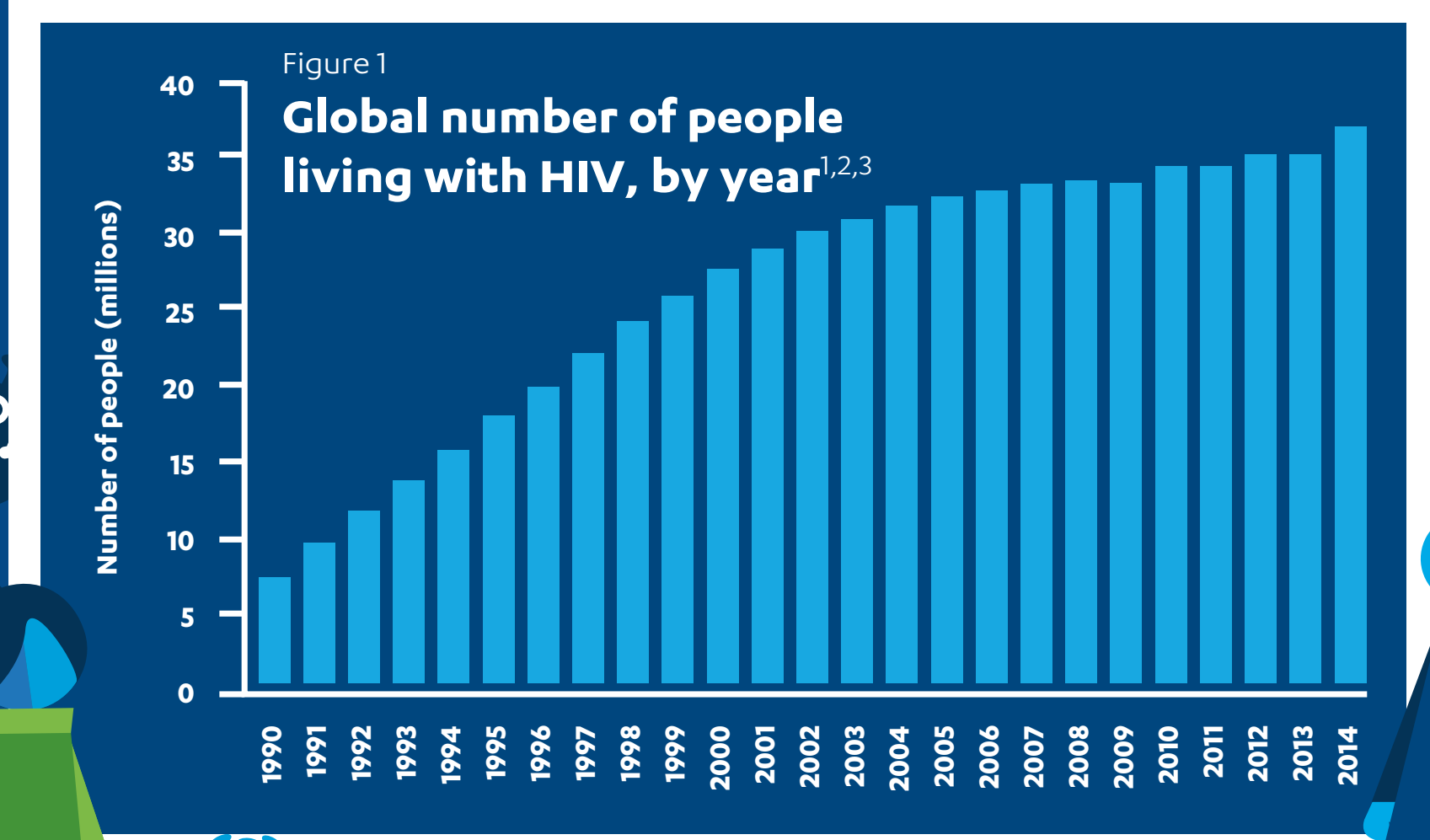

Around **37 million** people are currently living with HIV²

In 2013 **2.1 million** people were newly infected⁴

The world is making steady progress to end the HIV/AIDS epidemic

Since peaking in 2005, AIDS-related deaths have decreased by **nearly one-third**⁵

Since 2001, new HIV infections in children have fallen by **more than half**⁵

Thanks to **significant treatment advances** in the last 30 years HIV has been transformed from an **untreatable, fatal disease** into a **chronic one**

IRELAND

Know the Score: Get Tested! A national campaign to increase awareness of the importance of HIV testing among men who have sex with men

UK

Providing support to **NAM and aidsmap** which provides HIV/AIDS news, impartial information and critically important tools to a global audience

BENELUX

Pillcoach 2.0: A digital tool which helps patients to manage their HIV treatment including medicine reminders, appointment reminders and real-life intake registration

EASTERN EUROPE

Working in partnership with patient groups (NAM, EUCO, EATG, AIDS Action Europe, ITPCru) to establish localized, easily accessible, in-language resources for physicians, patients and patient group organizations

KOREA

Collaboration with the **Red Ribbon Center** of the Korea Salvation Army to raise much needed funding and awareness

THAILAND

Collaboration with **Give2Asia and The Life Skills Development Foundation** to help address the needs of vulnerable children who are affected by HIV/AIDS

GERMANY

'SOMEBUDDY LIKE ME': a digital platform for people affected by HIV and their loved ones to connect anonymously with others to talk about the topic

AUSTRIA

An annual **psychodynamic workshop** for physicians, nurses and social workers who want to improve their communication skills and psychological understanding of people living with HIV

INDIA

Collaboration with **Prerana** to reduce vulnerability to HIV of young people, especially girls at risk of human trafficking and sexual exploitation

INDONESIA

'HEBAT!' ('Live a Healthy Life with Friends') program: Collaboration with the **Padjajaran University in Bandung** to increase awareness and prevent HIV transmission among people of school age

AFRICA/ASIA

New Horizons: A collaborative initiative to build awareness, inspire action, advance learning and ensure treatment access to children
